

Covered Preventive Services

WOMEN

- 1. Breast cancer genetic test counseling (BRCA) for women at higher risk
- 2. Breast cancer mammography screenings every 2 years for women over 40
- **3. Breast cancer chemoprevention counseling** for women at higher risk Cervical cancer screening
- 4. Pap test (also called a Pap smear) every 3 years for women 21 to 65
- **5. Human Papillomavirus (HPV) DNA test** with the combination of a Pap smear every 5 years for women 30 to 65 who don't want a Pap smear every 3 years
- 6. Chlamydia infection screening for younger women and other women at higher risk
- 7. Diabetes screening for women with a history of gestational diabetes who aren't currently pregnant and who haven't been diagnosed with type 2 diabetes before
- 8. Domestic and interpersonal violence screening and counseling for all women
- 9. Gonorrhea screening for all women at higher risk
- 10. HIV screening and counseling for sexually active women
- 11. Osteoporosis screening for women over age 65 depending on risk factors
- 12. Rh incompatibility screening follow-up testing for women at higher risk
- 13. Sexually transmitted infections counseling for sexually active women
- 14. Syphilis screening for women at increased risk
- 15. Tobacco use screening and interventions
- 16. Urinary incontinence screening for women yearly
- 17. Well-woman visits to get recommended services for women under 65

PREGNANT WOMEN OR WOMEN WHO MAY BECOME PREGNANT

- 1. Anemia screening on a routine basis
- 2. Breastfeeding comprehensive support and counseling from trained providers, and access to breastfeeding supplies
- **3. FDA-approved contraception**, sterilization procedures, and patient education and counseling.
- 4. Folic acid supplements for women who may become pregnant
- **5. Gestational diabetes screening** for women 24 to 28 weeks pregnant and those at high risk of developing gestational diabetes
- 6. Hepatitis B screening for pregnant women at their first prenatal visit
